Here's what the latest guidance says:



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Emails & Less Formal Contexts

- Most modern sources (Indeed, Grammarly, LinkedIn writing guides) suggest you **can** use a comma if the tone is relaxed or if you're emailing someone you know.
- Indeed: colon for business letters, comma for less formal; both are acceptable (english.stackexchange.com)
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- LinkedIn/Grammarly: colon = most formal; comma = fine for informal or email salutations
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- More generally, "colon or comma is acceptable...however, the colon is considered more formal" (<u>english.stackexchange.com</u>).

- In formal U.S. business letters, stick with a colon after the salutation.
- In emails or less formal letters, a comma is acceptable—and sometimes preferred for tone.
- If aiming for maximum professionalism (e.g., cover letters, external documents), default to the **colon**.
